Craciun Fericit! Merry Christmas! The Christmas markets are open, the festive lights are twinkling, children are earnestly learning poems and songs for Christmas celebrations, St Nicolas made his deliveries on 6th December, the Christmas season is in full swing! Whilst no one here could be unaware of the impending celebrations, for a growing number of children, they are oblivious to the fact that Jesus is the Reason for the Season. More and more children in Romania are growing up without an understanding of what the birth of Jesus means for them personally and the whole of Creation. Please pray with us that this Christmas many children would hear of the good news of Immanuel, God with us.

Changes and Challenges

As we mentioned previously, a lot has changed since we last lived here. Not only has the cityscape changed, but the pace of life here has changed dramatically. Many people, from both the city and villages, have commented that life has become far busier with people trying to fit in extra hours at work, or a second job to make ends meet. People are more stretched and have less time with family and friends. One of Adi's cousins who regularly visits village churches to encourage them, struggles to find anyone to join him, where as in the past it was no problem to find a car full of willing participants. Our local church has mentioned that it has become harder to engage with the community due to the busier pace of life and extra commitments that pull people. Another change that people have mentioned is that there is a growing number of people who are no longer engaged with Christianity at all. It is a common phenomenon worldwide. With each generation, church attendance declines and resistance to the gospel increases. Nevertheless, God's plans and purposes cannot be thwarted and all those who are his will be drawn to him (John 6:37-40). Therefore, it is our passion to encourage and equip churches to engage with families and children in a way that is relevant and Biblical, so that every child hears the good news of Jesus.

"Building the Faith of the Next Generation"

It was a great joy to be invited to participate in this year's Alo Copii National Conference for children's leaders. It was a huge encouragement to see many people from all over Romania, gathering together to be further encouraged and trained to build the faith of the next generation. Adi was invited to run a workshop about "How to make the most of pre-written programs". The group brainstormed pros and cons of pre-written programs as well as discussing the fundamental elements of a Scripture based, gospel centred children's program. The workshop was well attended, and Adi got encouraging feedback from participants as well as the organisers. We are looking forward to further collaborations with Alo Copii.

We were also very thankful to how flexible and resilient both Anna and Luca were to meeting so many new people in such short space of time. It was a lot of travelling, but certainly worth it.
